THE PROBLEM

1. To provide for NATO use a common Voice Procedure for Ground Controlled Approach.

FACTS AFFECTING THE PROBLEM

2. A common Voice Procedure for Ground Controlled Approach is necessary to permit the conduct of communications between the Armed Forces of the Member Nations of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

3. The Voice Procedure for Ground Controlled Approach contained in ACP 166 is now available and is considered suitable for NATO use.

CONCLUSIONS

- 4. It is concluded that:
 - a. ACP 166 should be adopted for use between the Military Services of the Member Nations.
 - b. Member Nations (except Iceland) should be requested to advise the Standing Group as to the dates by which it can be made effective.
