MEMORANDUM FOR THE BELGIAN MILITARY REPRESENTATIVE


SUBJECT: Canadian Mutual Aid - Allocations to Belgium

Reference: Belgian M.R. Memo No. 570 dtd 6 June 56

1. It is confirmed that, with one exception, there was no recommendation made by the Standing Group for any of the items listed in the Enclosure to reference to be allocated to Belgium.

2. The exception is in the case of Shells 90mm AA offered in SGM-1955-52 of 19 August 1952. With regard to this item, the Standing Group recommended to the Canadian authorities, in SGM-219-53, that 10,000 rounds be allocated to Belgium. In Canadian Joint Staff letter CJS-332-4 dated 25 February 1953, the Canadian Military Representative, however, informed the Standing Group that all the 90mm ammunition which was the subject of this particular offer would not be available for delivery until the Autumn of 1953. The Standing Group are unable to trace any further correspondence on the subject and therefore cannot say whether or not this ammunition was, in fact, delivered.
