1. Forwarded separately, this date, in accordance with reference a, were advance copies of ACP 113(I), a revision of ACP 113(H).

2. ACP 113(I) is a CONFIDENTIAL non-registered publication consisting of routine additions, deletions and changes which are required to bring the ACP 113 series up-to-date.

3. The Foreword to ACP 113(I) states that the publication will be made effective when directed by the respective implementing agencies, and when effective will supersede ACP 113(H). For your information the United States will place this publication into effect upon receipt.

4. Bulk distribution of this publication is being initiated by the United States military services through the Military Representatives in Washington. The advance copies referred to above are identical to those which will be received through bulk distribution; however, the errata sheet is not yet available. With the exception of Canada and the European Military Communications

Coordinating Committee, addressees are requested to advise the Standing Group without delay if bulk distribution is not in agreement with the requirements indicated in reference c.

5. Military Representatives of European Nations are requested to forward the advance copies received to their respective Ministries of Defense in accordance with the procedures contained in reference a. It is intended that these advance copies be used by the Ministries of Defense in preparing national implementing instructions and in initiating translation when translation is required.

6. The European Military Communications Coordinating Committee is requested to monitor and assist, whenever possible, the national implementation of this publication and to advise all concerned when ACP 113(I) has been implemented by all NATO Nations.

7. It is desired that this revision be made effective NATO-wide as soon as possible. Unless NATO-wide implementation has already been effected, the European Military Communications Coordinating Committee will be expected to advise the Standing Group and Supreme Commanders of the status of implementation of this revision as of 15 July 1957.
