Information for the Press

Programme

7th December
18.00 hours:

Press Conference given by Mr. Joseph LUNS, Chairman of the North Atlantic Council and Secretary General of NATO.

To be followed by a reception for all accredited representatives of the Press in the NATO restaurant.

8th December:

The Defence Planning Committee (DPC) will meet in Ministerial Session - times of Sessions will be announced. At the end of the meeting, in the late afternoon, a Press briefing will be given by the Assistant Secretary General for Defence Planning and Policy.

9th and

10th December:

The North Atlantic Council will meet in Ministerial Session. After each Session on the first day a Press briefing will be given by the NATO Spokesman and his deputy.

10th December:

Closing Press Conference by Mr. Joseph LUNS after the meeting.

Telephones:

The international telephones are situated at the back of the Press area, next to the Post Office. There are 20 instruments and a Belgian Post Office operator to help you place your calls.

A further six coin-operated telephones, two in the Post Office and four along the wall opposite the Bank, are available for local calls.

Incoming calls may be routed through the NATO switchboard (41.00.40) to the Press Service (extension 2221). You will be advised over the public address system when a call is waiting for you.

Please keep these calls to a strict minimum, and if you are expecting a call please remain in the vicinity of the NATO Press Service (Office No. NB.146) and help avoid repeated use of the loudspeaker and the blocking of the international line.

Teleprinters: Five public teleprinters are installed in the Post Office at the back of the Press area.

Transport: A town bus, the number 65, runs regularly from 06.00 hours to midnight, between La Monnaie (the Brussels Opera House) and NATO Headquarters. Buses leave from the stop in front of the main gate every fifteen minutes.

The receptionist in the Press area has the telephone number of several local radio taxi companies.

Press Bar: The bar in the Press area, which serves sandwiches and drinks, will be open each day throughout the meeting for the use of journalists. The facilities of the NATO bar, cafeteria and restaurant are also available to you.
