CCMS FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME

The Secretary General of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization announced today the award of eleven fellowship grants under the 1974 Fellowship Programme of the Committee on the Challenges of Modern Society (CCMS).

The present awards mark the fourth successive year in which fellowships have been granted by CCMS to stimulate serious study of problems dealing with public policy as related to the natural and social environment. The programme accordingly complements the pilot studies sponsored by CCMS in a wide variety of subjects from Water Pollution and Disposal of Hazardous Wastes to Health Care and Solar and Geothermal Energy.

The eleven grants announced today will go to scholars in ten member countries: Belgium, Canada, France, the Federal Republic of Germany, Greece, Iceland, Italy, Portugal, the United Kingdom and the United States.
