MILITARY COMMITTEE TO VISIT

THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY AND THE UNITED KINGDOM

Brussels, 8 September 1994

The Military Committee of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization will visit military installations and armed forces in the United Kingdom and in the Federal Republic of Germany during the period 18-23 September 1994. The Military Committee is composed of the Chiefs of Defence Staff of each member country except France, which is represented by a Military Mission, and Iceland, which has no armed forces. The tour is one of a continuing programme of visits to regions of the Alliance.

During the United Kingdom part of this tour, the Military Committee will hold one of its three annual Chiefs of Staff meetings in London on 20 September 1994. The Chairman of the Military Committee, Field Marshal Sir Richard Vincent, will give a news conference after the meeting at approximately 16.00 hrs.

The visiting group includes the President of the Military Committee, General H.G.B. van den Breemen, RNLMC, who will be present during the meeting in London, for the Military Committee Tour itself Admiral T. Rein, NONA will be Acting President, the Chairman of the Military Committee, Field Marshal Sir Richard Vincent, the Chiefs of Staff, who will be accompanied by their Representatives to the Military Committee in Permanent Session in Brussels, and the Chief of the French Military Mission to the Military Committee. The Supreme Allied Commander Europe, General George A. Joulwan, and the Supreme Allied Commander Atlantic, Admiral Paul D. Miller, will also participate in the tour.

The last Military Committee tour was in September 1993 when Greece, Italy and Turkey were visited.
