NATO/CCMS PILOT STUDY MEETING
ON "ENVIRONMENTAL ASPECTS OF REUSING FORMER MILITARY LANDS"

The NATO Committee on the Challenges of Modern Society (CCMS) Pilot Study on "Environmental Aspects of Reusing Former Military Lands" will meet in Garmisch, Germany, on May 8-12, 1995. Launched within the framework of the North Atlantic Cooperation Council (NACC), this study is focusing on environmental clean-up of contaminated military sites.

The NATO Pilot Study, jointly led by the United States Department of Defense and the German Ministry of Environment, is holding its meeting in conjunction with a Defense Environmental Conference bringing together many communities which are involved in environmental management of defence property in Europe and throughout the world.

Dr. Jean-Marie Cadiou, NATO Assistant Secretary General for Scientific and Environmental Affairs, will give the opening address.

The primary objective of this third meeting is to review all the information gathered by the participating government officials and to explore ways to respond to the demand in Central and Eastern European nations to address environmental contamination at former Soviet military bases.

Representatives will attend from Belarus, Belgium, Canada, the Czech Republic, Estonia, Germany, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, the Netherlands, Poland, Portugal, Russia, the Slovak Republic, Ukraine, the United Kingdom and the United States.
