NATO ADVANCED NETWORKING WORKSHOP IN WARSAW, POLAND
SEPTEMBER 15 - 25, 1995

A NATO Advanced Networking Workshop (ANW) aimed at training top level computer network managers from the Cooperation Partner academic community is being held in Warsaw 15-25 September. The Workshop is organized by the Central and Eastern European Networking Association (CEENet).

CEENet was created in 1994, due in part to efforts begun at the first NATO Advanced Networking Workshop in Budapest. Its mission is to help coordinate international aspects of network integration in Central and Eastern Europe.

One obstacle to network development in central and eastern European countries has been the scarcity of highly qualified personnel. As a sponsor to this ANW, NATO aims to speed progress in implementing the Internet by providing network managers and researchers with top quality training.

This workshop will be attended by approximately 80 academicians from 24 countries, from Estonia to Albania and from the Czech Republic to Kazakhstan. Key speakers from NATO and Cooperation Partner countries will cover such themes as network and system administration, building a national network, communication and computational infrastructure, start-up and low cost alternatives, and VSAT communications.
