Second Telegram

from the Secretary General of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization to the Representatives of the Governments of Canada, France, the United Kingdom and the United States on the United Nations Sub-Committee on Disarmament

The Council today considered the second Report from the four Western members of the Sub-Committee.

2. The Council were of the opinion that the discussions in the Disarmament Sub-Committee were now based on the informal memorandum given to the Soviets by the United States Representative and on the Soviet aide-mémoire referred to in paragraph 6 of your second Report, which was a reply to the U.S. informal memorandum.

3. In these circumstances, the Council hope that, in order to ensure fruitful consideration of the problems involved, you can agree to transmit these two documents to the Council.

4. The Council also considered that, as suggested by Mr. Jules Moch and Mr. Harold Stassen, it would be useful if one or more of the Western representatives on the Sub-Committee should, as soon as you judge it appropriate, come to Paris to give the Council an idea of how the Western members intend to proceed with the negotiations.
